## MULTI-AGENCY ORGANIZATION AND COOPERATION

- **Forestry Assistance Program (2019+)**: in this position I work to promote ecologically-based forest and wildlife management on private lands by interacting with the local, state, and federal government agencies. On behalf of private landowners, state partners include the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development and the Michigan DNR. The Federal partners is the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service.
